

#### Request to Executive Board for funds for 1983/4

A request should be made for \$U.S. 500 as in the past.

The funds would be used primarily to publish the working documents on collecting In order to maximise the finances available, it was decided to make economies in the reports by publishing them in French or English, and not in French and English.

#### ICOM '83

[Programme of conference and post conference tour will be sent out shortly following further meetings between Chairman and Secretary of the Committee and the ICOM '83 Secretariat and the finalisation of various details. discussion about the programme took place.

The Chairman is to pursue the Committee's need for a meeting room holding c.100 people.

It was decided to print 500 copies of the 'Draft Reports' on collecting polices, which would be issued free to members of ICFA only.

Scholarship and its transmission (recherche scientifique et diffusion) and Education were two subjects for discussion during the triennial period 1983-6. With regard to the document THEME - ICOM '83 (circulated previously) it was decided that special attention should be paid to

### v Extending public access

In the interest of practicality it was decided to refine the decision made in Amsterdam regarding the photographic exhibition and to limit it to those countries which have provided reports on their collecting policies. It was hoped to get some financial support from Sotheby & Co. towards the cost of this exhibition.

- 6. Representative at next ICOM Advisory Committee (40th meeting).

  There would be no meeting of the Advisory Committee prior to ICOM '83, when the present Chairman would represent the Committee at the first meeting and the newly elected Chairman (for the period 1983-1986) would represent the Committee at the second meeting.
- 7. Rules: Posts of Vice Chairmen
  On a proposal by Mme Antonova, supported by the Chairman, it was agreed that ICFA Rule 4 (b) should be implemented and there should be elections, therefore, at ICOM '83, for two posts of Vice Chairmen, along with the posts of Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer and ten other members of the Executive Board, making a total of fifteen members in all.
- 8. New Collecting Policies

  No new collecting policies had been received by the Chairman (editor) since the Amsterdam meeting. A further period of grace of one month was, therefore, agreed to for additional reports to be received by the Chairman.

There being no other business the meeting was closed.

Visits were made to Bergues, Dunkerque, Château de Barly, Saint-Omer, Valenciem Douai and Arras, as well as to Lille. The Board was generously entertained by the municipalities of Lille, Dunkerque and Douai, and personally by M. & Mme. Oursel and M. & Mme. Ashley, to all of whom the Board offered its grateful thanks.
